## VIRTUAL PRODUCTION STORYTELLING MICRO-CREDENTIAL

Virtual Production is a rapidly evolving technology driving a digital transformation in the film industry. This filmmaking technique partners real-time 3D software with LED display walls and camera tracking to create photorealistic images for an enhanced realism and depth of perspective. Merging production and post-production pipelines to create new ways of making a film, animation or TV programming.

The training program will be offered as an Award to 20 Indigenous participants where the full cost of the program will be sponsored by IM4, Funders and Sponsors.

The curriculum design provides participants with an opportunity to expand their knowledge, skills, and digital portfolio with access to leading real-time filmmaking tools, industry professionals and production support in making high-quality micro-short films culminating in a public screening upon completing the training.

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
